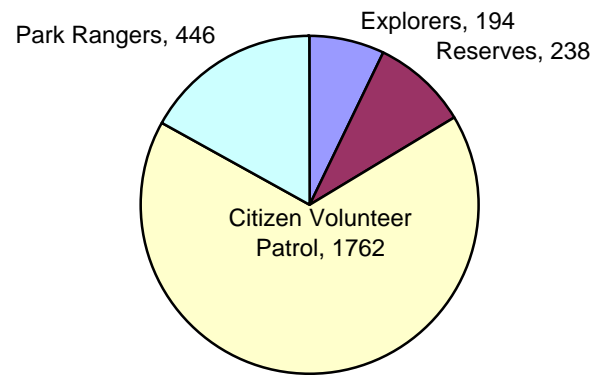
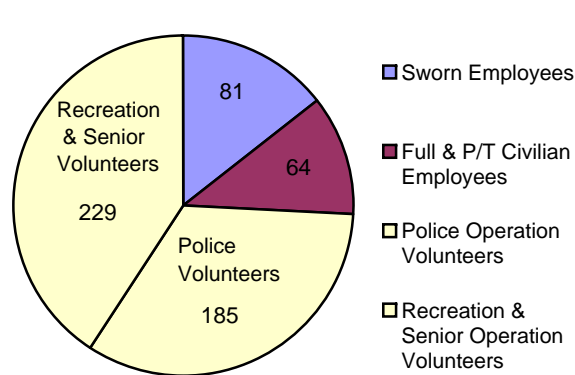
### Providing Police and Recreation To Our Community

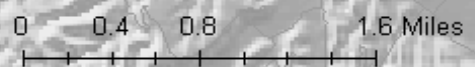

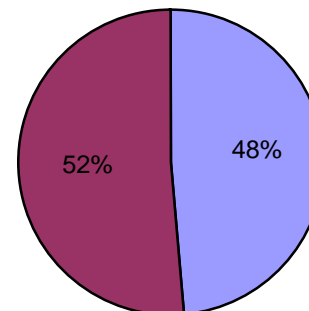

### Adult Arrests

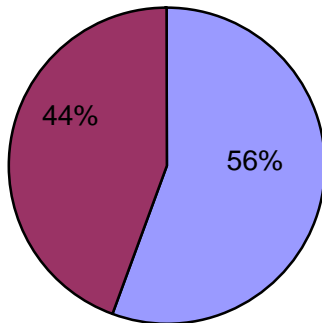


- Adults Arrested for Part 1 Offenses living in Redlands
- Adults Arrested for Part 1 Offenses living in other cities

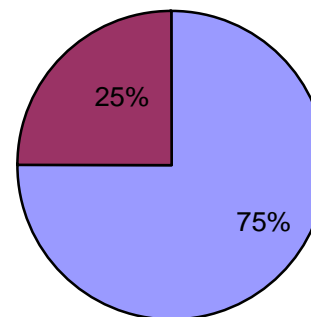


- Adults Arrested for Other Crimes living in Redlands

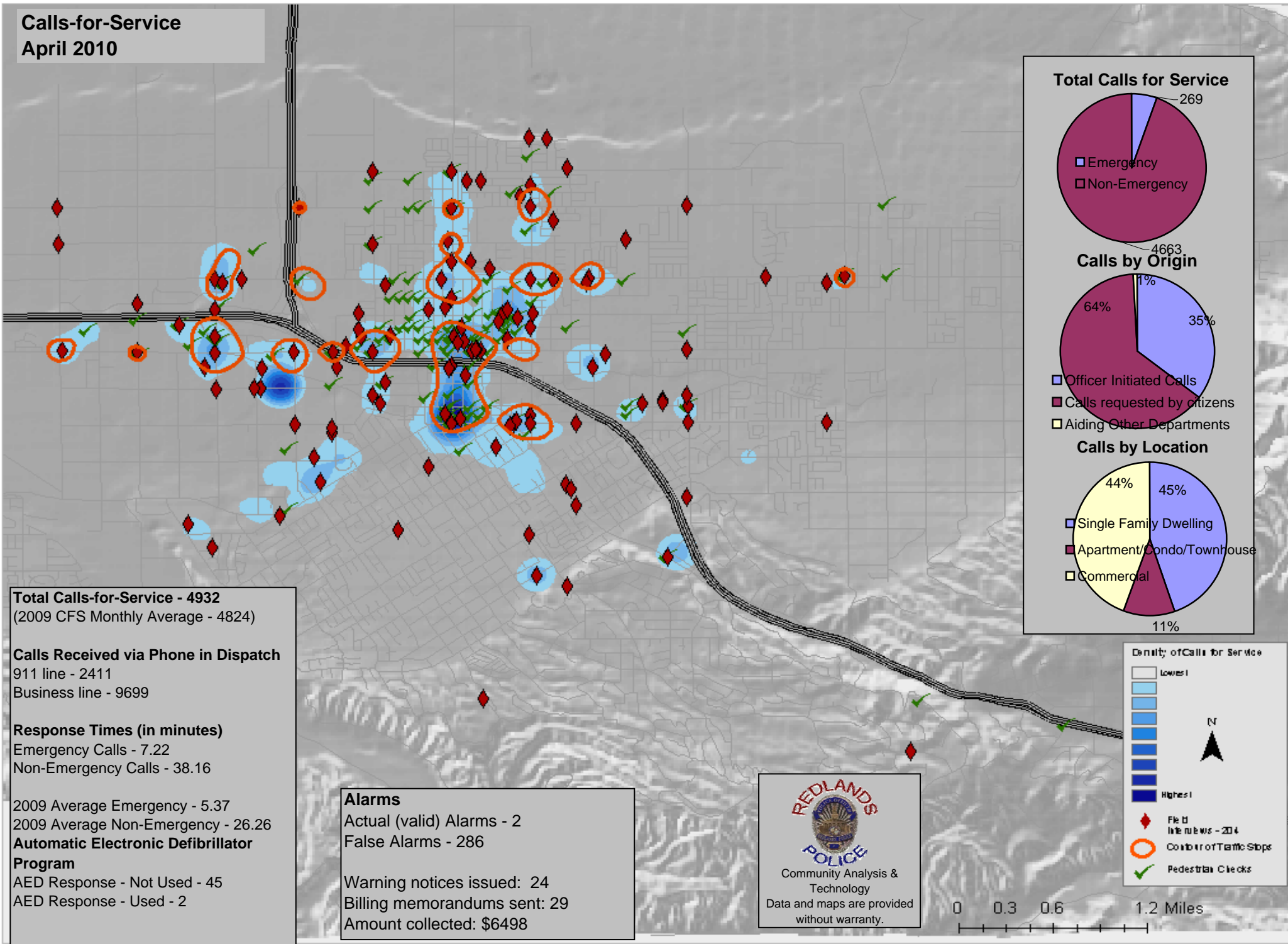
