Never Alone: Safely Back Home is a program designed for those in the Redlands' community who seek a means to provide an additional method of protecting family members or friends who have special needs as they go about their daily routine in our community.

WELCOME TO THE NEVER ALONE: SAFELY BACK HOME PROGRAM

Never Alone: Safely Back Home database contains helpful information for the Redlands Police Department to assist a database member's family or friends locate a special needs person who becomes disoriented or lost in the community.

The Never Alone: Safely Back Home code can be etched by you onto an identification bracelet, necklace, walker, cane, scooter, bicycle, skateboard, wallet, handbag, coin purse or other item the registered person may have with them if they become disoriented or lost in the community. The code can also be written in permanent ink on the back of a backpack or inside the lower lapel or inside collar of clothing. Choose an area from the suggested code locations or choose an alternative area easily accessible by a police officer.

UPDATE YOUR DATABASE IF YOU MOVE OR CHANGE YOUR INFORMATION

The Never Alone: Safely Back Home program is not designed to replace the necessity of a valid California Identification Card, medical bracelet, or other special identification.

FILLING OUT THE NEVER ALONE: SAFELY BACK HOME PROGRAM DATABASE FORM

- Fill out the questions to the best of your ability. There are no wrong answers.
- How could a police officer easily spot this person? Think of what would set this person apart from other people on the sidewalk.
- What distinguishing mark would be visible to a police officer? Is there a scar or tattoo on the hands or face?
- Make sure each individual is aware you have listed their name and number as a contact person in the Never Alone: Safely Back Home Database.
- Where is the first place this person may go? Think about the most likely locations a police officer might find this person if he or she wanders off or becomes lost or disoriented.
- What method of transportation might this person use?
- Where are the most likely locations a police officer might find your child if he or she does not return home?

Should this person become disoriented or lost in the community, call 911 and give the name of your family member or friend to the Redlands' emergency dispatcher. Redlands Police Officers will instantly be provided with all the additional information you chose to have entered into the Never Alone: Safely Back Home Database.
